Who knew we had a web presence and Facebook Page?



- Security Cameras & Signage.
- New Bedding for all of Men's services.
- Plumbing upgrades

Thank you Lord for directing these funds our way, we will continue to steward these funds as wisely as possible. We have every intention of deploying these funds for Your glory, as we maintain Your facilities to the best of our collective ability. In Jesus Name, Amen.
